A May Marked by Storms

In the last month, the United States has experienced a series of intense storms, particularly marked by tornado activity in various regions. However, amidst the chaos and destruction, members of the OPC family have felt the Lord's protection while incurring only minimal damage.

Most recently, across the Midwest, South, Southeast, and Southwest U.S., it's been reported by news sources that over 70 confirmed tornadoes swept through communities in 15 states over consecutive days, causing many to escape their homes, and suffer widespread loss of power. Reformation OPC in Gastonia, North Carolina sustained minor damage to their building after a nearby tornado touched down. It is hoped that the damage will be covered by insurance.

Just over one week prior to the tornado activity, the Houston area suffered strong storms and downpours that damaged homes and triggered evacuations. With thankfulness to the Lord, none of the Houston area OP Churches suffered any damage.

Tornadoes also swept through Oklahoma and Nebraska in late April. No known damage to OP Churches or church families has been reported from those storms. We praise the Lord for his protection during these powerful storms.

A Whirlwind of Activity for OPC Missionary Associate Jed Homan

Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. The past few months have been a whirlwind of activity here in Uganda, filled with both challenges and blessings. Let me share with you some of the highlights.

With the assistance of Zach [Nakhla], a visitor, we successfully completed the rewiring of one of the houses just in time for the arrival of the Grimsley family. Josh, Danielle, and their four daughters have joined us for a 1-year term as missionary associates. Josh, an Elder of the OP Church in Concho Valley, Arizona, is primarily here to assist with maintenance.

In February, David Nakhla from the Committee on Diaconal Ministries of the OPC visited briefly. He led a two-day class on the ministry of presence for members of the Mercy committee. Despite the church not yet being particularized and lacking ordained Deacons, the Mercy Committee, comprising faithful church members, has been meeting regularly to discuss how to help those in need within the church and the surrounding community. Please pray for them for continued wisdom in how to best help those needs both spiritual and physical.

Most afternoons in March were spent studying the local language, as Chloe and Leah, with the help of some locals, led an introductory class of Nakarimojon for Josh, Danielle, and myself. Although the group class has concluded, please continue to pray for me as I persist in my language studies both independently and with the guidance of a tutor.

With language studies occupying the afternoons, Josh and I utilized the mornings to tackle the long-overdue task of cleaning and organizing the shop. Looking back, it was a good time that Josh and I got to get to know each other a bit, see how each other works, and get him familiarized with the tools and materials we have on hand. Even I was finding things I didn't know were here myself after 8 months on the field. We have already seen time being saved and the frustrating question of "Where is ____" being asked much less, as things now have a proper home.
